Additionally, we've raised over \$2,500.00 for program ministry by eating (primarily) and supporting area businesses. The Trustees have used the summer to make our building even better for ministry use: an awning is being added to the Pryor entrance, the lower KK entrance (near the parking lot) is being refurbished,

and the parking lot buffer has been beautified with hostas, replacing dead bushes.

As we transition back into our routines of Fall, let us remember to give thanks to God for Summer (no matter which 'day' you experienced it!).

What's great about this conversational exchange is that there is no judgment in it! People are sincerely glad to see one another around here, glad to hear the stories of all the summer fun and glad to reconnect and refocus toward our shared ministry in this place.

Children's Ministry Report

Friends, any Sunday you're in worship for the moment 'especially for children' you become aware that our census is most definitely at the younger end of the age spectrum. We are blessed with an influx of little hands and feet and hearts that need the loving, patient, consistent example of God's love through story telling, singing and play.

I'm excited to incorporate my first career focus of early childhood/elementary education into the development of ministry programming for young children and families in addition to our regular Sunday School and ministry to children and youth that is already in place.

I have purchased an exciting faith formation resource for children 0-36 months (3 years old) called "Splash" and a new resource for elementary age children called "Spark". I have lots of thoughts and ideas for the program, parent education and small groups, room usage and outreach and I'd love to empower a group to help this vision emerge. So, I am organizing a new team of adults committed to the ministry of faith formation for our children. This team of volunteers will include:

- Sunday School Coordinators: Miss Debbie Bernal and Judie Liebenstein
- Visionaries (3-5) to discuss and dream into the path of children's ministry: meet quarterly – must have computer access.

This team will be working to secure these volunteers for the program year:

- Sunday School teaching adults (2 in each) for an elementary, a middle level and a high school class as our census drives the need. Weekly or on a rotating schedule.
- Three youth group facilitators – Friday night availability

Fascinating information awaits your learning and presence. We hope you will be there!


Volunteers in Mission – Winter Camp Cleanup

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO REGISTER?

Milwaukee Miles for Meals 2014 will take place in Veterans Park along Milwaukee's lakefront at 1010 N. Lincoln Memorial Drive. The event happens rain or shine, so please dress for the weather. Enter Veterans Park from Lincoln Memorial Drive, turning east onto Lagoon Drive. The run/walk will start at the parking lot at the end of Lagoon Drive. Free parking is available in the parking lots off Lagoon Drive, along Lagoon Drive and along Lincoln Memorial Drive.

Online registration is administered through First Giving. Donating through this website is simple, fast and secure. It is also the most efficient way to support your fundraising efforts.
