# Thank You All for a Year of Consistent Giving!

As this year of 2011 draws to a close your Finance Team would simply like to say, "Thank you." Thank you for your consistent weekly offerings, thank you for your special apportionment giving, thank you for supporting the United Methodist Special Giving Sundays, and thank you for supporting our local mission opportunities.

We realize these are difficult times in which we live, so we appreciate your continued financial support for our many ministries here at Bay View United Methodist Church even more. A special word of thanksgiving to all those who have pledged their support for the coming year.

There are many things that motivate us to give...not only to our church but to any one of the myriad of organizations that continually seek our support. We may have had a loved one stricken by a difficult disease so we give our support to researching ways of treating that same disease. But, especially at this time of year, we might make that one extra gift simply because it helps us out on our taxes! With that in mind, Tim Schultz of our Finance Team offers these bits of news that might help with some of your year-end giving decisions.

The provision permitting tax free distributions from an IRA directly to your church, or other charity, expires at the end of this year. Only those donors required to take a distribution (70 1/2 or older) qualify.

Also, there are possible tax law changes effective as early as January 1, 2012, (as Congress can make law retroactive to that date) which can place limits on itemized deductions, including charitable contributions and/or limits on those who can claim itemized deductions. In other words, a gift donated this year may be deductible, but not if it's made next year.
