It does not define any one pathway or population, it is a broad statement of inclusive, gospel grounded hospitality that is meant to extend both inward to those already present in ministry and community and to those who enter in for any reason.

Every week in worship we extend Jesus' invitation to children. In baptism, we promise to do everything in our power to increase their faith, confirm their hope, and perfect them in love. We also live into these promises when we provide a Safe Sanctuary for our children and youth.

The General Conference of The United Methodist Church, in April 1996, adopted a resolution aimed at reducing the risk of child sexual abuse in the church: "Jesus said, 'Whoever welcomes [a] child, welcomes me' (Matthew 18:5). Children are our present and our future, our hope, our teachers, our inspiration. They are full participants in the life of the church and in the realm of God."

The time commitment is minor – only a few meetings to provide input on the policy – but the impact continues on into the next generation.
