

# Important Information About Connection

We have been informed that 2014 brings new standard mailing regulations. Upon researching these new regulations, we have found that purchasing the software required would be cost-prohibitive. Not purchasing the software would cost us almost as in fees and additional postage. The cost increase is at least 100% of what we already spend on mailing the Connection, which is already 1/10 of the office operating budget. The solution reached by Ad Council is one that will not only cut budget costs, but will save on our use of paper and will make the Connection more accessible to the majority of Bay View UMC members. Beginning in January, Connection will be available in the Gathering Space, will be emailed directly to members and friends on our list, added monthly to our Facebook page and our website, and will be mailed only to those who can not make it to church on their own or live out of state AND do not have access to electronic copies. In order to make sure you receive your copy of Connection, send your email address to the church office at officeadmin@bayviewumc.org. We will also have information slips available for you to fill out in the Gathering Space if you need them, and a form on the website for you to print out if you need it. # Stewardship and Finance

When we Christians donate a pittance to God and lavish the remainder on ourselves, we become spiritual embezzlers. (If God Is Love: Rediscovering Grace in an Ungracious World by Philip Gulley, James Mulholland)

Congress has reauthorized the IRA Charitable Rollover for 2013! This means that if you are age 70 1/2 or older, and have a Traditional or Roth IRA, you can make a charitable gift from the IRA directly to your church or any other United Methodist Ministry before December 31, 2013. The gift may qualify for their required minimum distribution and you will not have to pay federal income tax on the amount given from their IRA to charity. If the required minimum distribution from an IRA is made directly to charity, is not taxable, but no charitable deduction allowed.

Also, a gift of appreciated stock (which is administered by Robert W. Baird without charge through the Foundation) does qualify for a deduction at its current value. Example, if you bought 100 shares of IBM at \$50, and it's now \$183, your charitable deductions is \$18,300. Assuming a 15% federal tax bracket, total tax savings, State and Federal would be \$3,060! If sold, the tax due would be at least \$1,800. There are limits on the deductions, but any amount limited is carried forward indefinitely, to be claimed in a future year.


