
### New Adult Study for Lent March 9-March 30

# The family 'duck pond' expands! Welcome to our newest "Methoducks"





### About Stacy and Joe:



Write about how reconciling (for ALL) reflects our church theme: Hope is here. Love is here. Family is here. Drop your reflection in the offering plate and it will be placed on the chancel cross as a witness for ALL to see.

Pastor Kelly and Pastor Andy were asked to weave our Lenten journey in worship with themes on inclusion for the purpose of providing an open forum discussion time following each hour of worship through Palm Sunday. Please plan to participate as often as you can!

A viewing of the DVD "Coming Out, Coming In" will be scheduled during Lent as well.

And, the rainbow flag (a symbol of welcome and safe haven for the LGBTQ community) will be moving about along with our Baptismal rock garden as a means of keeping the covenant we celebrate as God's children available for ALL.

The Core team will be better visible to you during this time as their nametags will designate them as members of this team and the questions notebook and list of members will remain in the corner of the Gathering Space.
