## More Than Rainbows

The visionary leadership of the Cabinet 7 years ago asked me to serve among you and to lead us in a reconciling process. Both Bishop Jung and Rev. Thompson (our District Superintendent) affirm my training as a coach and this reconciling process as an important part of my appointment to serve this community and this neighborhood. I am also blessed with a colleague who joins me in this call to welcome ALL.

An intentional welcome of ALL people here in Bay View is our current practice. Expanding our welcome boldly to Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer/Questioning persons of all ages is important as the general UM church experiences bad press for it's current violating action and language toward LGBTQ lay and ordained persons and allies. We stand and voice this welcome so that the bullied and harassed youth in our neighborhood and local schools will know that this is a safe and welcoming place. As our church embraces and continues to live out our willingness to welcome ALL, it will be added comfort and affirmation that we state our commitment for ALL to see!

It's been the better part of a year of meetings, conversation, planning and prayer for your pastors and the core team to bring our community to this moment. When we counted the green question cards we heard your

overwhelming voice loud and clear: Yes! We do understand what a reconciling church is according to the definition; many asking on the cards (and in conversation) why it's taken this long to get through this process as we are "already welcoming". Friends, taking this time ensures that ALL voices have a chance to be heard. We've put things in print, shared our stories, offered class time to talk, a notebook for your comments and resources to further educate anyone who wants to know more. This process is not about "hammering" an agenda but rather through graceful engagement; it's about opening a dialogue for growth, awareness and unity in our collective call to ministry in this place. As United Methodists, we affirm the spectrum of our belief – as beautiful as a rainbow, our journey of faith reveals more and more of God's heart to us individually and collectively as we dare to share together, struggle together, pray together and minister together along the way.

My teaching this year has focused on baptism, mission and Biblical understanding. When we baptize, we welcome that person, already blessed by God, to be further blessed (not persecuted) by their experience in this community. We hear God's call to reach out to everyone, without reservation or judgment, and we're encouraged to engage the Bible as a holy and living document. The Wesleyan Quadrilateral (Reason, Experience, Scripture and Tradition) informs our faith and guides our discipleship as we seek to follow Jesus with open minds, open hearts and open doors. Through good times and hard times, my faith practice is: first do no harm. When anger, fear, and uncertainty make it hard to see clearly, I rely on this tenant as I seek a way to be faithful through my daily living. My eyes and heart opened when I served as a Chaplain in the St. Camillus AIDS unit 14 years ago. I wrestled with God, like Jacob did, about what my role was with people who were sick and struggling with HIV/AIDS. God blessed me, not with a limp, but with a bracelet that I wear to this day that reminds me that ALL people deserve love and that my role is to help love grow first by that avenue to God's heart. I am called to be a conduit and I am blessed when people come closer to God through our community because together, we have made the way plain and safe for them.

I want to commend the work of the reconciling core team who has spent hours learning together, discussing, praying, sharing and finally now crafting words into a welcoming statement that I believe truly reflect the heart and spirit of this congregation for the ministry we share on God's behalf in this place. You'll be able to view the statement in this Connection issue and on the Green Sheet covers for June 1, 8 and 15. Having the overwhelming support (90% in favor) from you to move ahead in the process of becoming a Reconciling Congregation, we will vote to either accept or reject this statement on Sunday, June 15th at both services of worship. A vote of 75% or more in favor of the Welcoming Statement will identify Bay View UMC as a Reconciling Congregation. The email blast that is going out in conjunction with this Connection and the poster in the Gathering Space explain the ways you can offer your voice and vote if you cannot be with us in worship on June 15th.

Pray for our congregation, for ALL the people attending now and those who will come; our LGBTQ neighbors and friends, and ALL who live and breathe however they might as we worship and serve God, ALL together...let it be so.

Here's my question; "Do you believe your pastors should take action on social justice matters? If yes, why? If no, why not?"

While you're pondering that question here are some excerpts from a biography of John Wesley, founder of our denomination;

"Wesley never denied relief to a poor person that asked him."

"Wesley blamed the want of food and housing on a cycle of greed among the "haves," not the idleness of the "have-nots."

"Let those who are not poor in each Society pay for those that are."

In 1746 John Wesley instituted a short-term small-business loan program. That same year he arranged for a medical dispensary to be established in one of the London churches which was soon serving over a hundred people a month. He also leased two small houses in which "Wesley provided warm and clean accommodations for "feeble, aged widows." Wesley also established schools for children in the neighborhoods around his churches.

It would seem that issues of social justice were important to Wesley. Are they or should they be just as important to the church today? Another question I would have for you is under what circumstances should a pastor bring issues of social justice to the attention of the congregation?

So there is your homework assignment. I hope to hear from you soon!

## Servant Ministry: Usher Update

Our Lay Leadership team wants you to know what the roll of usher involves and invites you to pray about volunteering a Sunday to be a part of the larger pool of ushers or to step into a leading roll by serving as head usher one Sunday a month.

Ushers are...Servants of care and hospitality for ALL who worship in this place.

Ushers roll defined:

- ~ Care for the entire body of Christ in the worship space; worshippers and worship leadership alike.
- ~ Greet/well wish worshippers as they enter and leave the worship space.
- ~ Offer worship materials and provide seating direction or assistance as needed.
- ~ Circulate through the space to collect prayer cards and offering, to guide people through the Holy Communion procession and to meet individual needs as signaled.
- ~ Guide children to the worship space for their time up front and assist the acolyte (most often a child) with preparation and timing for their procession and recession of the Light of Christ into the worship space.
- ~ Care for the worship space so that it is neat and fully accessible before/after each use.

The Head Usher:

- ~ manages the usher team for that service of worship, serving as the point person for the team and leadership and delegating tasks to each team person.

Andy and I are very grateful to each of you who is currently ushering. YOUR work enables us to do ours with such ease, thank you!

Ushering is a great way to engage the congregation and offer your time and talent in a way that expands your experience of worship as you "see" it from a different angle. See one of the pastors or Muriel Blackwood if you'd like your name to be added to the usher team list.

## Ministry Spotlight: Bread & Jam

Bread and Jam. For me the name evokes images of life giving sustenance. Bread and Jam is a simple name reflecting a simple concept: food together. Bread may symbolize basic nourishment, while the jam seems to promise a bit of life's sweetness alongside the nourishment.

According to Bread and Jam's Volunteer Coordinator, Jan Colson, "Bread and Jam began in 1996. It's original idea was to help single parents with limited funds. Free meals were served the first and last Sunday of the month to anyone who came. It has evolved into a free meal served to any person who attends, regardless of religion or financial circumstances every Sunday."

Now that Bread and Jam is offering community meals every week the need for volunteers has grown. According to Pastor Kelly, one of the best ways to learn about Bread and Jam is to come and have a meal! Anyone can come! I must admit, I have never been to Bread and Jam. Who will venture through the doors with me?

There are service opportunities for people of most ages! Volunteers are needed to set tables and make sandwiches ahead of time. You can work in the kitchen or help clean up. A hot meal is shared and participants are able to take the sandwiches with them in a "bag lunch" for later. Our Bay View United Methodist Children's ministry has an ongoing collection of travel sized toiletries to provide for additional needs of participants, especially those without permanent housing throughout the year.

People are needed to keep this ministry going! One of the neat things about this ministry is that we get volunteers from other churches, service groups and individuals. Look for the sign up board in the Gathering Space. Bread and Jam begins at 3pm each Sunday. For more information talk with Pastor Kelly, Pastor Andy, Mary Kitzman or Jan Colson.

Come and see what it's all about. Adds Jan, "We offer food for the body and fellowship for the soul."

*In the old French language, the word "puie" was used to indicate a raised seat or balcony area. It is not uncommon for words to take on different sounds or spellings as time passes, especially as they cross cultures and languages, and that was the case here. During the 14th century, "puie" became "pew" in the English language.*

Did you see the new rain barrel? The 3 year olds painted the waves and the 4 year olds used stencils to paint the yellow ducks.

We have just graduated our 24th class of students at Loving Start. We had another great year with lots of fun and lots of learning. A group of young people with the Jett Foundation (a national non-profit committed to finding a cure for Duchenne muscular dystrophy) are cycling through eight states on their 4 week journey.

The cyclists travel from Minnesota to New Jersey in an effort to raise money and awareness for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (Duchenne) - the most common lethal disorder diagnosed during childhood today. The ride also gives a voice the the riders, most of whom have a sibling living with Duchenne.

As they travel through Milwaukee, the riders will be staying overnight here at the church. We will offer them a place to stay on Thursday, July 24<sup>th</sup>, give them a ride to the high school so they can get showered, and escort them to dinner. We are offering the riders breakfast first thing in the morning before they head out. We will need to get them on the road by 8:30am.
