You may have noticed that most Sundays at the conclusion of worship, Kelly and I hold hands as we leave the sanctuary. We do that because we are a team...plus, we really like each other!

I also have to give a big “shout out” to Paula Zarling, our Office Administrator. I can't thank her enough for her listening ear, her helpful edits of my bulletins, and especially for guiding this luddite through the intricacies of new technology.

But when I count all the many blessings I have received here in this place...I think of you. You have offered me friendship, guidance, encouragement, and support. You have invited me into the most sacred spaces of your lives and you have called me your pastor. I am humbled to have served you and you will forever hold a special place in my heart.

Sunday Morning Lights: a post-service reflection

So, for me church is a place to reflect, think, hope, and dream. Maybe because it is so peaceful and quiet compared to the rest of my week; perhaps because the Message (Homily/Sermon) is thoughtful and relevant, and especially because I am surrounded by members who genuinely strive to "practice" what is preached. As I sit, stand, listen, and sing, certain images and phrases jump out at me and I can't stop myself from jotting them down. For me they are like reflections that catch the light. I try to capture them on paper; my bits of brightness gathered, held close and carried forward with me when I walk out the door. May they bring you a spark of light as well.

Sunday July 9th, 2017

This is one of my first times worshipping "early" (8am!) at the outdoor service. The group is small and intimate. People are really listening to the Pastor, as well as each other. The wind blows against my ankles and the air temperature is perfect. I conclude that the setting alone is worth waking up early for. I join the circle of lawn chairs. I hope someone walking by will smile at the inviting space. I watch the sun's light creep over the brick church and into the eyes of a few church members. "Come as you are" comes to mind. You can wear your sandals and skirts; you can walk, drive, bus or bike to the square patch of grass. ALL are Welcome.

My first reflection is how the services at Bay View United Methodist Church are like a buffet. Come hungry! During the sharing aloud of joys and concerns, I feel a real sense of community as windows open into each others lives. Someone reminds us of the mantra "Give it to God", another gem I jot down for my week ahead (fittingly as I edit this reflection, I realize I have recently used this very tip to ease my anxiety about an uncertain situation at work).

My advice is to come to service with an open heart. You may hear things you agree or disagree with. When I can relate to bible readings or the pastor's message I feel a sense of community and reassurance. Even when there is dissention, I see several powerful benefits. One, why only preach to the choir? If we all agree 100%, where is room for growth? Second, we are all on different journeys and different things are relevant to people at different points in their lives. We are all continuously falling off the wagon and climbing back up (hence religion as a "practice"). You may think you don't belong at church because of doubts or uncertainties, but those are the very reasons many of us are here! Third, and perhaps the most difficult, is the reminder to practice love for "thy enemy" (ie: those with whom you disagree). When I struggle to relate to views different from my own, I challenge myself to listen and learn. When I huff "they're not going to change my mind", I chuckle because they are probably thinking the same thing about me and my views. We may not change each other's minds, but the deeper we know one another, the more compassion we begin to extend. This is a tremendous gift because it breaks down the walls between "us" and "them". It helps us to realize that each person is a multifaceted individual with unique perspectives, gifts to share, mistakes to make, and opportunities to grow. Each service at Bay View United Methodist Church offers me many thoughts and ideas. Best of all, I can apply them to real life! The teachings, both formal and informal, offer something for everyone. Just like at a buffet, you can even try something new.

Our voices join together in today's responsive sending forth: "*What a blessing it is that we are able to serve others as they have need.*" I think to myself, "that's a good one," and jot it down.

The Importance of Leadership

The hymn “We Are the Church” UMH 558 takes five verses to lay before us the basics of ‘being’ church. ... not a building, not a steeple, but the people, ALL kinds of people that march, learn, gather, sing, pray, laugh and cry as the Spirit guides their sharing of God’s good news of unconditional love and promise of presence. We are blessed, as we enter our eleventh year of ‘being the church’ together, with the wonderful shared history of training up two student pastors and celebrating five years of shared ministry with a local licensed pastor we brought back home to serve. New and long-standing outreach ministries (Memory Café and Bread & Jam just to name two) have created entry points for faithful service and our worship continues to be vibrantly led by a variety of musical gifts. The need for willing and able leadership will give on-going life and stability to our ministry in the coming days. Pastoral leaders change for a variety of reasons and as we transition beyond Pastor Andy’s service among us, I pray that we will continue on the solid ground of God’s grace and with the sure footing of a shared vision for ministry.

I am grateful for the committed leaders currently serving on the Accountable Leadership Board (ALB), and as the first class rotates off in January, we will be praying and inviting future leaders to consider a commitment to this vital group.

There will continue to be entry point opportunities to serve in short-term programs/events and over longer-term ministry commitments. I look forward to the inspiring presence of the Holy Spirit as she brings more new ideas that prompt more willing hands and hearts to join in joy-filled ministry, fellowship, and service to the glory of God.

Traditionally we have participated as a congregation in the September Miles for Meals event as the sole annual fundraiser for our Bread & Jam Free Community Meal Program. Last year as we prepared for the 5k

run/2k walk, Feeding America abruptly canceled the event. This year we contacted Feeding America to receive information on this year's Miles for Meals event and found out that in order to make resources and sponsorships count for more the Feeding America Miles for Meals race has officially been consolidated with another of their annual events, the Drumstick Dash. Feeding America's recommendation to Bay View UMC was that we instead sign up for this event, as the fundraising works the same as it did with Miles for Meals.

Cleaning the Coat Room

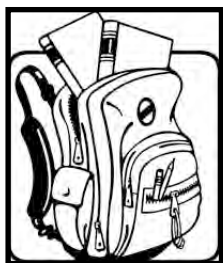

Music Ministries Fall Rehearsals Begin Soon!



The experience of worship is enhanced greatly by our diverse music ministry groups and each welcomes new participants this time of year! These small group ministries are excellent ways to meet new people and to form new friendships. If you enjoy singing, ringing, playing an instrument or want to be a part of worship leadership you are invited to look into one or more of our music ministry groups.

Each of these groups enhances the 10:45am service of worship.

Faith Singers Vocal Choir sings first and third Sundays and rehearses on Wednesdays at 6:30pm under the direction of Kathleen Matts. This group welcomes all levels of vocal and music reading ability. They sing a wide style range of 4 part anthems along with seasonal music and opportunities for vocal ensemble special music.

Wesleyan Bell Choir rings the second Sunday of every month and rehearses on Thursdays at 7:00pm under the direction of Mark Humphrey. These beautiful White Chapel 5 rank bells ring with honor as participants pride themselves on team work built on rehearsal commitment as old and new pieces build their repertoire.

Praise Band leads worship every fourth Sunday and welcomes both vocal and instrumental participation. A schedule of Tuesday night rehearsals (usually 2/month) is offered by coordinator, Stacy Johnson, and prepares this group to offer upbeat contemporary, spirituals and alt tunes to classic hymns using a variety of resources.

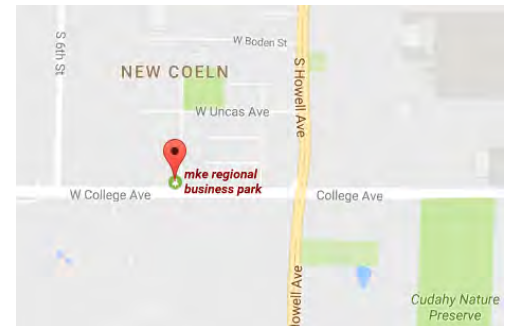
