From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers, Sisters, and Siblings in Jesus Christ,

Happy Easter! Are you ready to celebrate new beginnings? Spring is here and it actually almost feels already like summer has arrived as we have hit several high 70's and 80's in temperature. This month I

want you to consider new beginnings and signs of resurrection. In the month of March, we as a congregation were invited to read the Gospel of Mark. In this Gospel there were many healings, teachings, traveling to "the other side", and a unique perspective of the resurrection of Jesus.

In the last chapter of Mark's Gospel, in the original ending, we read: "Go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.' And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid."

This is not your typical Easter scripture is it? Have you ever been so afraid that you did not go and tell someone what caused your fear? I am sure it happens all the time. We might be embarrassed that we were scared and don't want others to see us as scaredy-cats. We might have witnessed something that could cause further harm if we told someone such as details of an accident. I wonder what was behind the actual fear that day in the garden tomb. Was it disbelief? How about shock? I am guessing that the five stages of grief were in play here and what we are seeing here is denial. Interesting isn't it? Peter denied Jesus as a friend, so what if those at the tomb denied Jesus at resurrected because it might have sounded too good to be true?

However, before we go too far in that direction, while the Gospel of Mark's original ending has the women saying nothing, we know that someone said something. How do we know? Well, because here we are over 2000 years later telling the Good News that Jesus Christ is risen, He is risen indeed! The tomb is empty. The stone is rolled away.

It takes great courage to tell about an empty tomb, even today in the year 2021. You might recall me sharing in my Easter sermon that those who worship on Easter Sunday, an average of 50% believe that the tomb of Jesus is still his tomb today because there was no resurrection! We cannot have the story end with people being afraid to tell the rest of the story. Jesus is alive! The tomb is empty! "Life is worth the living, just because He lives".

We all know somebody who needs to either hear this Good News for the very first time or someone who needs to reminded of this Good News once again. Will you be bold in your faith and go proclaim that Jesus Christ is risen today? Will you share why the empty tomb is important to you today? We must not let the story go that the tomb is not empty or the stone has not rolled away. Go proclaim! Celebrate! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Let the journey continue....

First In-Person Worship Service of 2021!

We will begin in-person worship on Sunday, April 25 at 9:45am. All are welcome! Online worship will still be offered through Facebook & YouTube. Masks will be required for in person attendance. At any point due to changing circumstances, the church may decide to return to online worship only. Failure to follow these guidelines might lead to being asked to leave the building. Please review our in-person guidelines:



HOW TO COME TO CHURCH

Wear a mask or face covering over nose and mouth. Provide your own tissue & cough drops as needed. Offerings should be placed in the basket at the entrance of the sanctuary.

Maintain social distance 6 feet at all times.

Refrain from shaking hands and hugging.



HOW TO ENTER CHURCH

Please use Clement/KK entrance and maintain social distance. Check in at registration table. Temperatures will be taken. You will be invited to fill out a connection card. We will use the information as a way to create a tracking system recommended by the Milwaukee Health Department and update your contact information in our church system. Wait for an usher to seat you in the sanctuary. Seating will be from the front of church to the back of the church in marked pews.



WHAT TO EXPECT IN WORSHIP

Prepare for a 45 minute worship service
Bulletins will be in the pews at the marked spots. At this time, we will not be singing hymns, but musical reflection will take place.
You may hum along. When Communion is provided the first of the month, pre-packaged elements will be provided. Please follow the ushers directions for both entering and leaving church.

POST-WORSHIP/EXITING CHURCH

There will be no fellowship time for coffee or food. Please exit the building the same way you entered. Maintain social distance. If you need to talk to the pastor, let Pastor Kevin know and he will meet with you in his office.

SAFETY/CLEANING PROCEDURES

The church will be sprayed each week with a Purerox Covid-19 EPA approved disinfectant. Doorknobs will be sanitized. Hand sanitizer will be provided at the front door and also by the entrance of the sanctuary.




