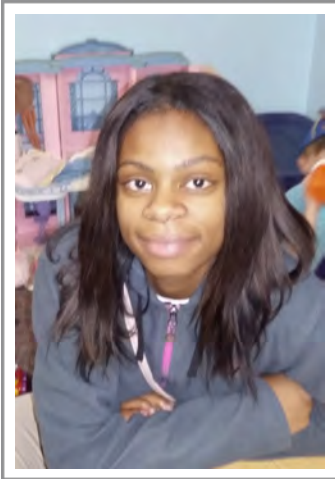

# Wisconsin Volunteers in Mission Work at Lake Lucerne Camp

More than 850 hours of labor were provided by 37 Wisconsin Volunteers in Mission at Lake Lucerne Camp the week of October 1-6. The group sanded and varnished the chapel floor; repaired signs that woodpeckers had pecked on; worked in the low ropes area creating a new whale walk, a group wall and a balance beam; built six new picnic tables; finished the dry-walling, mudding and painting in Aspen; created and painted a new design on the Camp Store; stained the deck on the Retreat Center; brought in the waterfront equipment and repaired the piers; trimmed trees, chipped wood and filled wood boxes; painted walls in Giese Dining Center; did electrical work in Pine and Elm; and did a lot of fall housecleaning: washing curtains, washing windows, vacuuming carpet, etc.



In addition, the group was able to provide a monetary contribution in the amount of \$5138.63, in part to cover expenses incurred during the week. Each morning began with devotions before breakfast. Evening devotions were followed by a variety of card games, board games and visiting among "old" and new friends.

Upcoming NVIM trips will be going to Detroit later this month, Florida in January, Alabama in February, North Carolina in March, South Eastern Wisconsin in April, Pine Lake in May, and Red Cliff and UMCS in the summer. 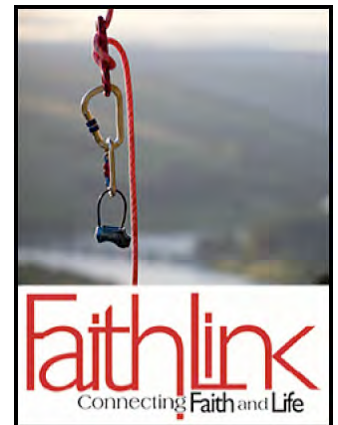
## New Member Class

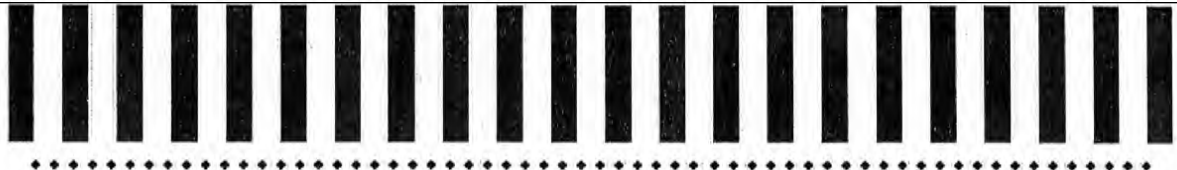

## Ways to Dash

1. **Designate an offering to our Drumstick Dashers:** You can do this by sending money through the Sunday offering plate or by mailing it to the church office. Please be sure to note that it is for the Drumstick Dash. This offering will go directly to our Bread and Jam account and is **the best way to help Bread and Jam financially** at this time.
2. **Pledge our Dash participants:** So far we have several people committed to participating in the Dash on Thanksgiving morning, with one person signed up officially. Pledging can be done through the [registration website](#). [Click HERE](#). You can make a pledge to the team or individual participants. Go to the **VIEW TEAMS** page if you're not already there. Find **team Bread and Jammin**. Click the **PLEDGE** button. You will then be directed to a donation page. Pledge funds go directly to Bread and Jam's Feeding America account.

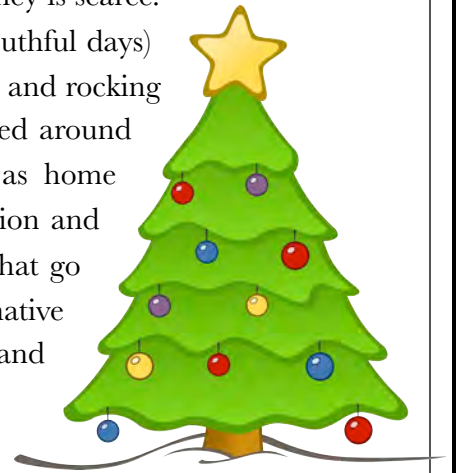


3. **Register to run or walk:** Participant registration can be done at the Feeding America [race website found at THIS LINK](#). Our team name is Bread and Jammin. Be sure to choose "Join Team" in order to make your registration count toward Bread and Jam. Registration is \$30/adult, \$20/child (children 4 and under free) through November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The price goes up after that. Though most of the money for registration goes to fund the event, a small portion does go into our Feeding America account.

Appalachia is a region in our country where neighborliness abounds but money is scarce. When I visited Virginia, West Virginia, and Tennessee (back in my more youthful days) the people I encountered were so generous about sharing food, drink, stories and rocking chairs. The view from the porch was lovely and some conversations centered around difficult choices related to money. Families had to prioritize items such as home repairs, heat, food, clothes, shoes, school supplies, medical care, transportation and "luxuries" like toys. Parents yearn to provide their children with pleasures that go beyond survival. Things like art supplies, sports equipment, games, imaginative toys and learning toys allow children to explore interests, develop talents and "just" be kids.



Christian Help of Mingo County in West Virginia aims to serve families in compassionate ways. Their annual Christmas gift drive connects gifts from willing donors (us!) to families in need. This allows parents to take a step back from at least one difficult decision during a costly time of year. The heat may be turned down low, or melting snow might drip through the tarpaper roof into a pan, but there is enough food on the table and items under the tree to bring smiles and lightness to little hands and hearts. 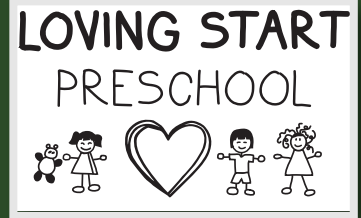
